President's Foreword

Pony Club Members and Supporters

I present my annual report for the year 2002 for the Pony Club Association of Victoria.

Insurance

Once again insurance has been a centre of attention. Our insurers for the last twelve months, Triton, were unable to offer us cover through an Australian registered company for this year. Our brokers, AON, have succeeded in placing our insurance with a Lloyd's group. The new policy gives back nearly all the cover that we lost last year, including participation, automatic landowner cover and improved personal accident terms. Better still, the insurers have indicated that they wish the association to be ongoing. A new insurance booklet is being prepared and will be distributed as soon as it is ready. AON also advise that they also have cover available for member's horses and saddlery. Inquiries can be made through the PCAV office.

Governance

The proposed changes to the Rules of Incorporation will be voted on at a Special General Meeting to be held in conjunction with the November council meeting. The current proposal is a "minimalist" model, with the main change being the transfer of voting power from Clubs to Zones. The council has endorsed this proposal. A summary of the proposed changes and the reasons for them has been circulated to all clubs and James Fitzpatrick and I have visited a number of Zone meetings to explain the reasons for the changes and to answer questions.

Executive Officer

James Fitzpatrick was appointed Executive Officer following the resignation of Jacquie Anderton last October. James was not appointed until April, which left the office short staffed for several months and put a heavy load on Suanne Waugh. James has had a wealth of experience in association management and I believe he will make a valuable contribution to PCAV.

Events

Australia was the host of the Interpacific Exchange Rally for 2003, an event which takes place every second year and which circulates around six Pacific rim countries. Riders came from Japan, New Zealand, Canada and the US. Hong Kong was unable to send a team because of the SARS epidemic. Because of administrative difficulties, Victoria was asked to host the whole event, which included finding two lots of 30 horses, one for the Kangaroo Cup horse trials at

Werribee and the other for the Nations Cup showjumping at Wodonga. Danielle Vidler was the Victorian representative in the Australian team. Danielle did a great job both as a rider and as host to the visitors. Danielle will give a short talk on her experiences later this morning. The Zone Teams horse trials conducted in conjunction with the Kangaroo Cup looks like becoming an annual event.

Victoria was also host to the National Senior Mounted Games held at Werribee. The mounted games committee ran the event most successfully, the only disappointment being that Victoria was put into second place in a run-off against Queensland after they had tied at the end of the scheduled games.

The National Championships in dressage, showjumping, horse trials and games were held in South Australia and a full contingent of Victorian teams competed.

Northern Metropolitan Zone ran the dressage and showjumping championships at Coldstream and Northern Zone held the state eventing championships at Tocumwal. Both events were very successful and most competently run.

The state games weekend at Geelong was the usual noisy affair and thoroughly enjoyed by everyone.

My thanks to the members of council for their input through the year and specially to the executive which has put in many extra hours. Cheryl White has decided not to seek re-election as Vice president because of other commitments. Thank you Cheryl for your contribution.

The office staff has worked under very difficult conditions for a large part of the year and I thank them for their efforts.

My thanks to all pony club members and supporters whose volunteer input is what keeps the wheels turning.

Our new employees are Georgia Appleton as the PCAV Trainee and James Fitzpatrick as Executive Officer. We look forward to serving and leading the PCAV in to a period of continuous improvement.

Risk Management is always important and continues to be a priority for the PCAV. The efforts will increase in 2003-2004 with a formal Risk Management Plan to be implemented.

The management practices of the PCAV were reviewed through a government funded "Governance" review. With input from Council, Zones, Clubs, the structure and reporting methods were discussed at length. A final model is being presented to the 2003 Annual Conference.

The new membership database project funded by Sport and Recreation Victoria commenced and this microsoft access based system will be developed to meet the needs of PCAV for membership information.

The Inter Pacific Rally was a highlight as Victoria hosted the event in May 2003. It was a privilege to work

on such a well organised and rewarding event. Congratulations to all the volunteers who made this event possible as it was a credit to the PCAV.

Dispite the turbulent year, the administration of the PCAV was implemented with professionalism and enthusiasm. With new staff now employed, the year ahead should prove to be very productive and positive. I will assist the PCAV Council and Committees in developing a really positive organisation, with a clear vision and strategies, and an organisation that is relevant to the needs of the riders today and future generations. The PCAV volunteers and staff work tirelessly to help the riders enjoy the well structured program. It's time to implement actions that will really impact on the organisation and make the necessary improvements.

The theme for the year is "Making a Difference" because that's what we need to do for Pony Club to survive in this rapidly changing industry.....

State Coaching Director



Once again it has been a very busy year. There were two Major Events. The National Pony Club Championships in September 2002 at Roseworthy Campus, South Australia and the Inter Pacific Exchange here in Victoria. Both events required a great deal of organisation,

planning and coordination.

On the Instructional front, the Comfort and Safety workshops which were so successful last year have been continued this year. Designed to cater for any body in Pony Club they cover such areas as safety for horse and rider, saddle fitting and gear check. There was one held in Horsham in June, Glenormiston in July and a further one to be conducted in Bairnsdale in August. My thanks again to Robyn Harris, Chief Instructor of West Gippsland Zone, and Pam Davey, Master Saddler, for their help and expertise in co-presenting these workshops. Horseland Lilydale has supported us again by allowing us to borrow a full range of gear and accessories that enhance the presentation.

Several Zones now run Orientation to Coaching workshops. These are designed as an educational tool for all members of Pony Club. For those who wish to coach they are a pre requisite for the National Coaching Accreditation Scheme (NCAS) Pony Club Level 1. The State run NCAS PC 1 Course has 24 participants enrolled. The first part of the course took place in July the second takes place in November.

Victoria hosted a National "A" & "B" Certificate Examiners workshop in March. All States and Territories were represented. It was instigated to try and look at national standards for Certificates. There was lively debate and we are well on the way to a National Instructional Syllabus review.

The NCAS PC Level 1 Syllabus is also under review. A meeting was held in November in conjunction with the Australian Pony Club Council (APCC) meeting. A facilitator from the Australian Coaching Council (ACC) guided us through the process. All NCAS Syllabi are

subject to review every four years under ACC guidelines as part of the accreditation procedure. The philosophy and parameters for an NCAS PC Level 2 Certificate were also discussed. This is in the pipeline but will take some time to go through the rigorous review procedure.

Sue Chandler has been appointed National Coach by the APCC. Her first clinic in Victoria will be held on August 23rd & 24th at the National Equestrian Centre at Werribee Park.

I would like to thank all riders who have helped at the Clinics and workshops that have been run throughout the year. Without demonstration riders these would be impossible to conduct. I would also like to thank the CIP for their hard work throughout the year and to Stephen Coffey and Council for their continued support.

The 2002 – 2003 year has been a busy and rewarding one for the Clubs in the Barwon Zone of the PCAV.

Judy Beasley from Barwon Valley Pony Club was welcomed onto the Zone Executive Committee as the new Barwon Zone Secretary, we thank Jan Faulkner for the time and commitment she has given in this role.

Throughout the year riders have competed successfully at every State event including the Speed to Safety competition finals held at Flemington racecourse in conjunction with Racing Victoria.

Within the Zone the Clubs are very active, with up to 14 One Day Events conducted as well as numerous Combined Training days, Dressage & Showjumping competitions, Camps, Gymkhanas and Horse shows.

In February each year the Ballarat Polocrosse Club conduct a Pony Club Challenge, inviting all Clubs to attend.

In addition to all these activities the Zone conducts qualifying events for State Championship selection. These events are held at Zone Clubs on a rotational basis and are always a very successful day for both the host club and the Zone.

On the Instructional side, every Club within the Zone is visited each year by members of the DCI and ZA Panel. Our ZCI, Maxene Argento and her husband, Joe, have been particularly helpful and encouraging.

An Instructors Clinic and a K Co-ordinators Clinic were both well attended, the biannual ABK Clinic will be held by Barwon Zone in 2004 more details in February.

So far this 2002 – 2003 year, approximately 65 riders have been examined for their C certificate and 60 more are preparing for the August test. All these riders are a credit to their Clubs, the co-ordinators and the examining panel.

Barwon Zone were pleased to nominate the following members for the Award of Merit, Claire Rowe 19 years and Brook Sadler 20years from Barwon Valley Pony

Club, Lesley Lucas 20years from Ballarat Pony Club, Corey Ferrari 19 years and Josie Ferrari 19 years from Lochard Pony Club. Congratulations to you all.

My thanks to the Clubs and the Zone members for their continued support and enthusiasm for Pony Club throughout the year.

August 2002 saw the election of the new Zone Executive, with Glenda Perry taking over from Stewart Don as President, Barb Richards returning as Secretary, Caroline Gepp moving on to the Treasurer role and a new Vice President in Norm Glenn being elected. Wendy Abey took over as the new ZCI following the retirement of Fay Mitchell and Lyn Hurley accepted nomination as the Zone Examining Secretary.

The number of clubs within the Zone remained steady at 23 but there has been a disappointing 5% reduction in riding members for the twelve months ended 31 May 2003. Hopefully this trend will reverse during June when final numbers are known.

Central Zone remains a busy and vibrant part of the Pony Club movement, with activities, in addition to normal rallies, taking place most weeks and offering the full gamut of equestrian pursuits. The drama and uncertainty of the insurance crisis now appears firmly behind us and the focus of clubs can now be on the fundamentals of the movement to encourage young people to ride and to learn of all things horse oriented, leading to the promotion of the highest ideals of sportsmanship and citizenship; the encouragement of self discipline and the improvement in strength of character.

PCAV Governance, including the role of the Zone Committee to disseminate and encourage the two-way flow of information, was the topic of a separate meeting of Zone during November 2002. The fundamental changes originally envisaged have now given way to more evolutionary changes for debate at the Annual Conference. Information at Zone level is now more

completely dealt with, assisted by the purchase of a new computer during December and the appointment of Norm Glenn as web co-ordinator to oversee the Central Zone web site.

Zone activities to allow for qualification of riders to participate at State in dressage & showjumping, games and flat teams were well supported by all clubs. The hard work and practice of members saw success in these areas, with grade 3 Dressage finishing first and grade 2 dressage third at State. One of the games team placed a very creditable second, whilst there was also success in the flat and musical rides. A new State event, based on the InterPacific rally concept for grade 3 and grade 4 riders, will be trialled in 2004 – this event will provide further incentive for middle grade riders to compete on a bigger stage and, if the interest shown in 2003 is any guide, there will again be keen competition for the twelve places available from this Zone.

The organization of the Zone games and flat teams qualifying event was the subject of a new manual produced by Jenny Spilsbury and Norm Glenn – hopefully, more clubs will be willing to hold this Zone event now that a blueprint exists for its successful staging. The development of the use of composite teams has been a most welcome innovation, allowing smaller clubs to pool together to allow more riders to experience the fun involved.

Part of the fund raising activities for the staging of the 2004 State Horse Trials by Central Zone saw a Zone dressage day being introduced this year in April. The competition was held in conjunction with the EFA Dressage Competition, with the number of entries received enabled all five rings to run profitably.

The requirement that riders competing at State level events must hold their "C" certificate has been the reason for the large increase in certificate examinations, with eighty four candidates undertaking "C", one candidate undertaking C* and two sitting for "K" shortly. As part of our attempt to streamline this process, examination dates for the majority of candidates have been set for March and August each year.

Club visits, Orientation to Teaching (OTC) courses, clinics for instructors, "judging dressage" night for judges, pencilers and all parents, "C" certificate information nights and Course Designing Clinics have all been run successfully under the watchful eye of the ZCI – as usual, there is a continuing need for additional ZA's, DCI's and Course Accreditors. The continual task of seeking out possible candidates for these positions is one that the Zone members undertake – the conflict with the many other activities available in modern society makes the successful achievement of this task difficult.

Being involved with Pony Club is immensely satisfying but can be personally challenging because of the time commitment required. My personal thanks to Glenda Perry and Barb Richards without whose help I would not have been able to see the year through; to the members of the Zone Committee of Management, my thanks to all who contributed to making the year a good one.

This year the riders in the Zone competed well both in State and National events and considering the amount of travel involved we could always field a team of competitors.

On competition it was great to see Danielle Vidler represent Victoria and in the Australian Team for the Inter-Pacific Rally, East Gippsland is justifiably proud of her achievements.

Unfortunately we have had one Club go into recess due to failing numbers of parents prepared to take on official Club duties but on the other hand another Club has climbed up from being almost in a similar position and is now a strong healthy Club.

I attended my first rally at a Club earlier this year that promoted Riders without Horses, what a rewarding day. I have been instructing Pony Club from over 20 years

and I really enjoyed the challenge. I feel PCAV will have to set a format for these children as otherwise we may lose this idea. Thank you Briagolong Pony Club for this day.

The Comfort and Safety workshops being run by State seem to be well enjoyed and well supported, but we must not lose sight of the bigger picture of saddlery and equipment. I feel we must take on a lot more knowledge of equipment from other fields of horsemastership to encourage Pony Clubbers to stay on at Pony Club rather than be locked into the traditional English styles only.

East Gippsland Zone is hosting the State Horse Trials in 2005 and already a good steering committee has been set up and constructive ideas formulated to be well completed by the due date. The location at this stage is still at Rosedale even though Rosedale Pony Club is in recess. The East Gippsland Zone has taken the allocated dates for the Rosedale Pony Club rallies so we do not lose the access to the Rosedale complex for holding Horse Trials.

During the year Jacquie Anderton left the position of Executive Officer and has been replaced by James Fitzpatrick, we wish James all the best in this position and congratulate him on his appointment.

Much has been discussed at all levels regarding the issue of governance of Pony Club and many discussions have been held at both Club and Zone level and the general consensus is that we are close to having the format correct but feel we will have a better understanding of the overall attitude of the State after the Annual General Meeting.

Over the last 12 months there have been various schools within the Zone for various levels of riders and Instructors and those have been generally very well attended due mainly to our hardworking Chief Instructor Sonia Perkins. This Zone has had a frequent turn over of Chief Instructors over the past few years. It is good to see Sonia dig in and give this position the continuity it deserves. She is setting an example to all in the Zone as to what Pony Club is all about, her knowledge and attitude is an example to us all to try and achieve more.

With the requirement for "C" Certificate to compete at State Level it has put a lot of pressure on our examiners. To them and all other examiners who have strived to get children up to "C" and to have maintained the standard when so much pressure has been put on to allow Pony Clubbers to compete at State level it is only the Pony Club itself that the requirements for "C" level were never allowed to falter.

I have enjoyed my first 12 months as Zone Representative for East Gippsland Zone and hope to fulfil this position for some time to come. May the next

12 months be a great year for Pony Club and into the future.

It is pleasing to see that some of our clubs are still supporting the "Riders Without Horses" program. Clubs continue to present candidates for pony club certificates, with many of our riders passing their "C" certificates this year.

Two riders from Bendigo Pony Club have been nominated for the Award of Merit.

Over the past year the Zone has run qualifiers for all State Events, including the Zone Shield Events for Teams Show Jumping, Games and Team of Four Flat Ride and Zone Horse Trials.

Our Zone has been represented at all State Events again this past year, including the Grade 3 teams event at the Inter-Pacific Competition. Members also provided horses for both the Inter-Pacific competitions held at Werribee and Wodonga. At the State Horse Trials in May we had riders place in grade 2. At the State Dressage in February we had an individual rider place in grade 1 along with our and our grade 2 dressage team. Unfortunately we were unable to have any riders jump PA grade. Our teams in PB and PC rode well.

Midland Zone riders have gained selection to represent Victoria. Elise Macer is an emergency in the Senior Games Prince Phillip Games squad. Jessica Mills traveled to New Zealand represent Victoria in EFA Show Jumping.

In February 2004 we are hosting the State Dressage and Show Jumping Championships. This will be held at the Avoca Racecourse. A sub-committee has been

formed and is working towards putting on a worthy event. We look forward to seeing you in February 2004.

Schools of Instruction have again been held this past year. In our continuing attempt to reduce travelling and attract more people, we again held two schools on the same day at opposite ends of our Zone. This seems to be successful as they are well attended. In March, Debbie Browell gave a presentation on Cross Country Jumping technique.

We have had one dressage judge's information evening so far this year with Rosemary Williams. A second will be held in September with Maree Gahan and Beryl Pearse. The aim of these is to assist and encourage prospective dressage judges.

Tocumwal Club for providing excellent facilities; green grass, in a drought and the use of the football oval last used by horses in 1939. Narelle Bond from Tocumwal is our new Chief Instructor and has had

To Bev Parsons our new DCI and also Zone Examining Secretary has been very busy getting C certificates passed all year.

Congratulations to Kristen Peskie and Megan Glenn on passing their K test. Riders went to the games clinic in January. We are sad to have Lockington Club go into recession because of lack of numbers.

Northern Metropolitan Zone has had a particularly busy year with the running of the State dressage and Show jumping Championships as well as our usual four zone events – in fact from the zone show jumping & dressage qualifying day in December through to the teams horse trials in June, it was sometimes hard to distinguish when one event finished and preparation for the next one started.

On top of all this the DCI/ZA panel has been hard at work organising clinics, workshops and training days for riders, coaches, judges and parents. These have included orientation to coaching and level one instructors clinics, show jump course design and builders clinic, dressage judges training and accreditation workshops, eventing, dressage and show jumping clinics for riders at all grade levels, as well as our ever popular ten years and under camp for our junior members.

'C' certificate preparation and examining has continued unabated with very few eligible riders in the zone not having attained their 'C' certificate. A positive spin off from this push for 'C' certificate has been an increasing interest in 'K', with a number of clubs in the zone appointing 'K' coordinators to assist and support their members to meet the requirements of their 'K' certificate.

Our riders have been well represented and successful at all state events and the Inter Pacific Teams Horse Trials event for Grade 3 riders, which was a huge success and enjoyed by all participants. A number of our riders also loaned horses for the visiting teams. Congratulations to the organising committee of this event, as well as to organisers of all state events, which have been a great opportunity for competition, but more importantly for fostering sportsmanship and friendship amongst pony club members from around the state.

A number of our clubs are fortunate in seeing a resurgence of members, however others are facing the threat of closure or amalgamation due to a variety of factors including increasing urbanisation, loss of grounds and increasing bureaucratic constraints associated with insurance liability and lease agreements – all factors which take time and energy to deal with that could be more usefully directed towards activities and programs for the benefit of their riding members.

Finally, NMZ executive must acknowledge the enormous importance of our many volunteers and supporters, including clubs and zone delegates, many who have been with us for decades and without whom the zone would be unable to continue providing such a varied and worthwhile program of activities for its members. This year we were particularly pleased to

acknowledge and thank Neil Clinton for his contribution to the zone when he was awarded a life membership at our Yeringberg event in March.

This year has been full of activity around the zone starting with a DCI Panel workshop covering the topics of dressage judging and riding and also aspects of show-jumping, including early training building up to jumping grids and a course. Questions, from and to the audience, created a learning atmosphere for parents, pony club members and instructors. This year Victoria hosted the entire exchange on behalf of the Australian Pony Club Council. Planning began mid 2002 when we resurrected most of the Committee that had organised the 1999 National Pony Club Championships.

Rules of the Exchange state that two competitions must be run. A scramble Teams One Day Event called the Kangaroo Cup and a Nations Cup Showjumping competition. There should also be another horse related activity, this was covered with Trail Riding at Tooma. While the competitions are an important part of the Inter Pacific Exchange equally important are cultural exchange and the friendships made.

The Exchange began in Melbourne with the Kangaroo Cup ODE that was held at the National Equestrian Centre at Werribee Park. In conjunction with this Event we ran the inaugural Zone Teams Challenge, a Teams ODE for Grade 3 riders. National Mounted Games

The National Mounted Games (NMG) Sub Committee has had an exciting and busy year.

After team selection and many months of intense and strenuous training and many long kilometres covered, our Junior and Senior Teams competed at the National Competition at Roseworthy South Australia in September 2002. A fabulous, if exhausting, experience for all of us to be part of the Beyond 2000 National Competition for all riding disciplines.

The NMG Sub-Committee conducted the annual Mounted Games Skills Training Clinic at Werribee Park over the long and very hot 41c Australia Day weekend in January 2003. Over eighty riders from across Victoria attended for the weekend with most staying overnight. Selection was held on Sunday afternoon for the 2003 NMG Training Squads.

Twelve riders from clubs across Victoria were chosen for each of the Junior & Senior Squads and for the first time 12 riders under 14 years were chosen for the Development Squad. The Senior Squad had riders from as far away as Cobram and Maryborough covering the hundreds of kilometres to attend ongoing training. We all admire their enormous commitment.

The Senior Team riders participated at intensive training sessions from February to April 2003 when Melbourne hosted the National Senior Competition at Werribee Park. The NMG Sub-Committee organised and staged this event and sincerely thank all the pony club riders who lent their beloved ponies for riders from interstate to use. In a message from an interstate competitor they say *"Thank you, thank you, thank you! By far the best National Event I have ever taken part in. The organization, accommodation and activities were outstanding. So many friendships made and strengthened and memories that can never be taken away"*.

The Junior & Development Squads continue to train alongside each other. Senior riders from our 2003 team coach the Development Squad together with other

well qualified coaches who rotate the coaching responsibilities. Both squads have ridden HC at several games competitions and the Junior Squad attended an arduous selection day where the final team of five riders and a reserve rider were chosen to represent Victoria at the National Competition in Tasmania later this year.

Every six out of seven years, a junior Mounted Games rider from Victoria is selected to join a representative Australian Mounted Games team. Ellyse Davis from Macclesfield Pony Club is our representative for 2003 and heads to Canada in August with the other Aussies in an attempt to bring home the cup.

On behalf of all the NMG Squad and Team riders, I would like to publicly express our sincere appreciation to those clubs and their wonderful volunteer officials and members who have hosted squad and team training days and overnight camps at their grounds. They have "fed, watered and accommodated" all of us, loaned us horses to ride for training and uplifted the teams with their enthusiastic encouragement and support. Our thanks also to the selectors who give so generously of their time and expertise and undertake the very difficult task of selecting our Victorian NMG Squads and Teams.

The NMG Sub Committee is constantly reviewing and improving the processes and guidelines under which they operate. Our aim, with guidance and practical support from PCAV, is to increase access to the Skills Training Clinics and to promote the safety, fitness and nutrition programs which partner the riding skills. We intend to further develop our regional & rural training clinics for zones and clubs to encourage riders, coaches and stewards and broaden their exposure to the benefits and fun of mounted games.

State Events

Speed to Safety

Flemington Racecourse was again the venue for the 2002 *Speed to Safety* supported by Sport & Recreation, Victoria. The program was developed primarily to teach the art of "riding with feel". In 2001 the PCAV Chief Instructor's Panel recognised the inability of many Pony Club riders to ride at a given speed and the potential risk this posed. *Speed to Safety* is an education program that encourages Pony Club riders to distinguish the feel of a range in speeds. With the ability to determine the speed and the skill to ride a known speed, the rider develops a new dimension of control.

Six Zones across Victoria: Barwon, Midland, Northern Metropolitan, Southern Metropolitan, Wannon and West Gippsland conducted training clinics at local racecourses where riders were provided the opportunity to experience riding on a race track and master the skills of "riding with feel". Many of the training clinics included the expertise of local racehorse training identities, offering a glimpse of the racing industry whilst teaching valuable experience.

Riders were divided into one of two sections: Grades 1 & 2 were Section 1 whilst Grades 2 & 3 were Section 2. Each section rode two speed trials over a 1000 metre distance.

- Section 1 Speed A = 575 metres per minute
closest time to **1.44.34**
- Section 1 Speed B = 620 metres per minute
closest time to **1.36.77**
- Section 2 Speed A = 525 metres per minute
closest time to **1.44.34**
- Section 2 Speed B = 575 metres per minute
closest time to **1.54.28**

Victoria Racing Club hosted the final event at the Flemington racecourse, fitting the riders into a huge Spring Carnival racing schedule The Nivea Visage Girls Day Out. Our Pony Club riders were well tested on the day contending with the noise and excitement of raceday whilst encouraging their horse to ride to the allocated time. The timed trials made even more rigorous by not all riding to the same time.

All participants acquitted themselves well finishing very close to the designated times in challenging circumstances. When next competing on a cross-country course, time penalties should be the least of concerns to these riders! Congratulation to all that participated on the day and to the riders who attended the Zone training sessions. Southern Metropolitan

Zone performed well on the day finishing with first placing in Section 1 and Section 2. Both Sharnika Blacker Section 1 and Lisa Cluning Section 2, were presented with beautiful woollen horse blankets donated by Horseland with minor placings received felt ribbons.

Many thanks to the co-ordinators within the Zones and to the workers who contributed to the success of the day. Particular thanks to the timing and scoring combinations of Robbie McLeash, Val McKenzie, Jim and Eileen Hurley and Anthea Sutherland.

Speed to Safety is an event that is in its infancy. The objective is to develop safe and competent riders whilst providing them with new and challenging experiences. It is hoped that the track clinics and event experience can continue and become better by learning and maturing each year.

Hosted this year by North Metro Zone in the beautiful Yarra Valley at the height of the devastating bush fires. Horse Trials

Host Zone: Northern Zone

Venue: Tocumwal

Date: 3rd – 4th May 2003

It is my pleasure to give a brief report on the recent State Horse Trials Championships held at Tocumwal in May 2003.

After somewhat slow start, the Championship venue started to take shape. The uncertainty of Public Liability being available, made the committee a little unsure whether the event would run. It was my observation that this event was going to run on a very small work force. Perhaps the huge distance of clubs within the Zone was a contributing factor, along with clubs in remote country areas not realising what a prestigious event for Pony Club is the Horse Trials Championships

I think all would agree the venue for the Championships was excellent. The Dressage held on the football oval gave extra class to the event, and we must acknowledge with thanks the Tocumwal Football Club, who gave permission to hold this phase of the the Horse Trials on their grounds.

The Cross Country Phase of the Horse Trials, which is very dear to my heart, was run over a very picturesque setting along the Murray River. The bush setting for many riders I can imagine, was a little unique for them. The terrain was excellent for riding, as the sandy loam ground was kind to the horses, specially when Victoria was in severe drought conditions.

The construction of the course was mainly done with natural timbers, and even though there was not a large amount of variety, proved not to be " the sinch course", or the "below standard course", that was being rumoured around before riding. Trevor Feltman, course designers object, was that the rider was to ride the course, as some combinations took that extra degree of riding. The factor that the track was a shorter distance justified this.

The Water jump as usual took its fair share of refusals, and perhaps one of the highs of this event , came when there became on official measurement of height of the jump at entrance to water being included in the Horse Trials jump specifications.

Overall I was extremely pleased with how the course rode, with a degree of difficulty being shown in the final results, without being ridiculous, and perhaps the greatest aspect of the Cross Country Phase, that it was safe, and that no rider was hurt during the event.

Perhaps at this stage I could say that this may be the direction that future courses be built with a realistic affordable cost to Zones in Pony Club. I would like to thank Trevor Feltman for the manner in which he carried out his job, and knowing how difficult it becomes when you live approx 150 kms, from the venue, I know what a great effort Trevor made, along with other members of Northern Zone. Thank you Trevor, Morris Brown, Fiona Matheson (Zone Rep) and Northern Zone for making my job a pleasure.

The Showjumping Phase was also well designed and had that great working surface. It ran well over the weekend thanks to all concerned. The only regret I have with the running of Horse Trials is that we don't run Horse Trials in the correct order. e.g. Dressage, Cross Country then Showjumping, as this in my mind truly shows the capabilities of the horse to come back to being sound for Showjumping.

In conclusion, thank you to the committee of Northern Zone for a job well done, thank you for asking me to be your Technical Delegate, and thank Council for your support.

The Safety and Gear Check: went extremely well with only two saddles low on the horses back and two pairs of stirrup leathers requiring stitching – all were passed after the problems were rectified.

Flat Teams State Championships: We had a total of 25 Flat Teams from around the State competing for the Championship title. First place was awarded to Mornington Peninsula Pony Club (South Metropolitan Zone) who scored 218 points out of a possible 280 points. The regular practice and hard work each team puts into the Flat Team Ride section was once again apparent. Eight of the Flat Teams were also riding in the Musical Ride Team Championships.

Musical Ride Teams State Championships: This year we had a total of 21 Musical Ride Teams competing. Upper Beaconsfield Pony Club (West Gippsland Zone) won the Championships gaining a total score of 88 points out of a possible 100 points. The wide range of choreography, music and enhancements shown by all teams was of a very high standard and the capability of the teams was delightful to watch.

Kay Irving Memorial State Games Teams Championships: 25 Teams competed against each other for the Kay Irving Trophy. Macclesfield Pony Club (South Metropolitan Zone) won the Trophy with a total score of 280 points out of a possible 300 points. The enthusiasm and determination of the Games teams again produced an exciting atmosphere for participants and spectators alike.

The standard of the majority of the Lane Judges was very good and it was obvious they knew the rules of the games. It is important that Zones submit competent Lane Judges as, not only do the Games run more smoothly, but no team is disadvantaged by a Lane Judge who is ill-equipped for the task.

We, the State Games, Flat and Musical Ride Teams Committee, would like to congratulate all the riders (and their horses) who competed in the above events. It is great to see the teams working together and having fun. It was a very successful weekend, made possible by a group of hardworking volunteers.
